In 2009 all providers were twice asked (spring and fall) to record changes in the Housing inventory. During the 2009 KPIT, Kansas Coalition Against Sexual and Domestic Violence worked to remove barriers for residents of DV shelters to participate. People in both sheltered and unsheltered homeless situations were asked what housing activities and services they needed most to end their homelessness. To determine unmet need several methods were used. At a local grassroots level, providers in each regional council were asked to identify unmet need based on their perceptions of programmatic and housing needs of their clients this information was compared to national statistics and calculations.

Our TH coverage is 47% a 16% increase over the previous year with the addition of two new projects joining HMIS. We have two VA projects (Federal Gov.) currently not participating, with a total of 172 transitional beds. Planning has started to develop a data integration strategy with these two programs, which would raise our percentage to 79%. Other changes that will have a positive impact on HIMS participation include the required participation of: All HPRP participants; All ESG program participants; All PATH participants. Projects will be monitored monthly for data quality and utilization of the HMIS system, except those prohibited by law (e.g. DV shelters), by employing the bed utilization tool.

Describe how the data on the sheltered homeless population, as reported on 2I, was collected and the sheltered count produced (limit 1500 characters):

A stratified sampling methodology was used to determine the number of counties needed to provide a statistically sound estimate of homeless persons in KS. All 105 counties were divided into key strata by population size, density and percent living in rural vs. urban areas. Based on the strata, the counties were categorized into a four tier system and a recruitment process was employed to engage counties in the KS PIT count- of the 105 counties 36 had some level of participation on 1/28/09. The BoS is divided into 7 regions, each with a regional coordinator (RC) who served as a team leader to identify housing providers; solicit participation; distribute forms; provide support and training before and during the count; and collect surveys from 595 survey respondents.

Extrapolation: Among tier 3 counties 10 of 17 participated where 80 persons were identified as homeless. For each remaining county (n= 7) 8 persons were ascribed to the county for a total of 56 extrapolated homeless. Among tier 4 counties, 12 of 74 participated; 30 persons were identified (2.5 per county average). Of the 31 most populous counties, each ascribed was 3 homeless persons; and 31 least populous counties were ascribed 2 persons each for a total of 211 added to the 648 PIT count for a total of 859 for the BoS.

Comparing the 2009 point-in-time count to the previous point-in-time count (2008 or 2007), describe any factors that may have resulted in an increase, decline, or no change in the sheltered population count (limit 1500 characters):

In 2009 United Way of the Plains coordinated the first Kansas statewide P-I-T process joining all five Kansas CoCs in a coordinated effort to increase our knowledge base about homelessness. The coordinated effort facilitated joint planning, standardized approached to ensure fidelity to the implementation and creating a useful planning tools for all KS communities. As a result the BoS CoC was much better organized and prepared to participate in the Kansas statewide P-I-T process. Because of the standardized process and expert guidance BoS was able to add extrapolated figures to the actual interviews conducted for a truer picture of the homeless population and their needs in Kansas' rural and frontier areas.

Interviews: The KS BoS CoC conducted interviews with homeless persons staying in an emergency shelter or transitional housing program who were homeless on the night designated for the point-in-time count.

The data collected is representative of persons who were contacted during the KPIT and who were willing to participate in the survey. There were 595 survey respondents and 213 people accompanying the survey respondents. 584 participants gave their living situation on January 27th. In addition to the 808 found in all homeless situations another 211 were added to the final number of persons who were literally homeless through the extrapolation process for an overall total of 1019 people represented in all homeless living situations. The extrapolation was necessary in order to represent the 69 counties that did not participate in the 2009 KPIT.

The 2009 Kansas PIT compares the trend data documented by the National Alliance to End Homelessness for 2007 to the data collected in 2009. For the numbers reported for the KS BoS, the number of literally homeless decreased by 78 persons; the number of chronically homeless increased by 27 persons; the number of homeless persons with children decreased by 117; and the number of unsheltered homeless decreased by 25. During the past five years the KS Statewide Homeless Coalition on behalf of its homeless service partners representing 101 counties, has successfully applied to HUD for Homeless Assistance funding through the Continuum of Care application process - \$29 million in federal funds have been brought in to Kansas to create transitional housing and permanent supportive housing bed for more than 500 homeless individual and families. It is not likely that the new beds created through the BoS CoC is the sole explanation for the estimated decrease, however it is likely to be a part of the explanation.

The KS BoS CoC covers a large, rural area and does not have homeless-specific providers in some areas. Because rural areas have a higher percentage of homeless families, it was imperative to elicit participation from service providers most likely to encounter unsheltered families such as school district homeless liaisons, DV programs and Community Action Programs. The Kansas Department of Education's Homeless Education Coordinator contacted every school district homeless liaison and the liaisons themselves were contacted by the CoC. The Kansas Coalition Against Sexual and Domestic Violence helped coordinate participation of the DV programs. Many rural domestic violence programs report those fleeing domestic violence may receive services, but don't stay in their shelters because the location is well known in a small community. Community Action Programs were also targeted and PIT volunteer trainings were conducted.

Two new projects that will create 42 new permanent housing beds, 8 of which are dedicated to chronically homeless individuals. Work with the HOME TBRA program manager and TBRA grantees to target a portion of vouchers for chronically homeless individuals and track chronic homeless status upon intake in the program. The KS BoS Cos 2009 scoring system for new projects were awarded extra points for the percentage of chronic homeless individuals to be served.

Describe the CoC plan for creating new permanent housing beds for the chronically homeless over the next ten years (limit 1000 characters)?

Working with state and local planning groups (i.e. Kansas Interagency Council on Homelessness members), KSHC supports the increase the number of permanent housing beds dedicated for the chronically homeless with the goal to increase the number from the current 20% to 40% by 2019. Through monthly regional coordinator contact, the CoC will continue to identify areas of greatest need for permanent housing within the BoS, collaborate with regional leads and high performing agencies to foster future plans for permanent housing, and work assertively to provide assistance to the local agencies in garnering support for new projects.

The BoS CoC has already exceeded this threshold and will continue to maintain with slight improvements by promoting Supportive Housing best practices at the annual KSHC Summit on Housing and Homelessness and by providing technical assistance to projects. Blaylock Residences (new this year) was developed as a SHP best practices demonstration project and it is proposed in this application to replicate the model in another community. New projects are scored on their demonstration of clear plans to accomplish this objective.

The CoC will promote the Supportive Housing model through workshops at future KSHC annual Summits and regional meetings. Through monthly regional coordinator contact, the CoC will continue to identify areas of greatest need for retention in permanent housing within the BoS, collaborate with regional leads and high performing agencies to foster future plans for permanent housing, and work assertively to provide support and assistance to the local agencies in garnering support for projects.

The rate of persons moving from Transitional housing to permanent housing is 36%. The Kansas BoS is working closely with the HPRP grantee to assure that these funds are effective in both preventing individuals from entering homelessness and/or rapidly getting them into housing. The information about those experiencing /or at-risk of homelessness gathered in the HPRP process and the new/enhanced partnerships will be extremely valuable in refining strategies for assisting Kansans to find and keep housing. Through their new HUD VASH program, the VA has created over 105 units of permanent housing w/ supportive services for homeless veterans and their families primarily in BoS areas. Most veterans being served are coming from the Domiciliary or other transitional housing programs. The KS 10 year plan spells out strategies for developing 844 units of safe, permanent, affordable housing, with supportive services. The goal is to create 200 newly identified units in the next 12 months.

As previously stated, the KS 10yr plan includes creating 844 units of housing over the next 5 yrs. Many of the housing resources in the state such as TBRA, HOME, Tax Credit project, etc. will be dedicated toward accomplishing this goal. The VA VASH program, which covers many counties in the BoS, is projected to continue to provide funding for permanent housing subsidies for the foreseeable future. The CoC and partners will provide technical assistance to projects on best practices in permanent housing. Through monthly regional coordinator contact, the CoC will continue to identify areas of greatest need for permanent housing within the BoS, collaborate with regional leads and high performing agencies to foster future plans for permanent housing, and work assertively to provide support and assistance to the local agencies in garnering support for projects.

Forty three percent of persons are employed within the BoS CoC upon program exit. To maintain or increase this threshold, the CoC will increase participation of WIA providers, educators, local business and other diverse stakeholders in the BoS CoC planning process; and, increase participation and collaboration of KS Department of Social & Rehabilitation Services Vocational Rehabilitation specialists with projects. New projects within the CoC are scored upon their clear demonstration of plans to assist participants to increase their employment. The VA sites serving all the counties in BoS have hired new Supported Employment staff in the last 12 months. These staff members are providing tailored one-on-one services to veterans to find and keep employment, specifically those with severe and persistent mental health issues. Some of BoS homeless population (between 20% and 25% of the adult population are veterans) can benefit from these new services.

Forty three percent of persons are employed within the BoS CoC upon program exit. To maintain and increase this threshold, the CoC will work closely with the Work Force Centers who serve their specific areas and will refer those desiring to work for assistance in finding work. Kansas Legal Services, a CoC partner, provides skill training for homeless persons. Referrals will be made, as appropriate candidates are determined by BoS services providers when initial screening is completed and for those whom employment is a goal. Persons identified in this process will also have the option of being referred to Temp-agencies located in their area as a starting point for gaining employment.

Two applications have been developed and submitted with this Exhibit for SHP TH programs to provide rental assistance and supportive services for 19 more families in Kansas. The CoC will work with HOME TBRA program manager and grantees to target a portion of vouchers for homeless households with children. The VA sites serving these BoS areas have received HUD VASH funding and staff to provide case management services and create new housing options for veterans and their families experiencing homelessness. Additionally, the VA has new Grant and Per diem projects, and new Enhanced Lease projects that will provide new services for veterans, both with and w/o families to gain housing and necessary services. The CoC will work closely with VA staff to help assure that all eligible veterans are referred, thus providing new resources for veterans and their families. The CoC will work with HPRP manager & grantees to target a portion of funds for homeless households w/ children.

The CoC plans to continue to working closely with the VA to especially address homelessness among veterans with families. The VA is represented on the KSHC Board, with BoS CoC being updated regularly on status of HUD VASH supports. Through monthly regional coordinator contact, the CoC will continue to identify areas of greatest need for permanent housing for households with children within the BoS, collaborate with regional leads and high performing agencies to foster future plans for permanent housing, and work assertively to provide support and assistance to the local agencies in garnering support for projects.

Foster Care:

Youth who leave the foster care system because they age out (have attained 18 years of age) are eligible to participate in Independent Living Services through the Chafee Foster Care Independence Program. This is a voluntary program and youth may choose not to participate. Prior to discharge/release at 18 years of age, youth receive information concerning transitional planning which includes information on housing, employment and educational services available to them through the Independent Living Program. Transition plans do not include direct discharge to homeless shelters.

Health Care:

Kansas Department on Aging is reviewing its policies and regulations for Nursing Facilities, which includes Nursing Facilities for Mental Health. Kansas Hospital Association has been contacted and informed of this directive from HUD and the KICH has identified this as a priority in the 10 year plan to facilitate conversations and actions to improve health care discharge protocols. The VA is subject to new guidelines developed and published in Mental Health Uniform Code of Care (June 2009) which signal a change in the way VA service all veterans and specifically address the issue of "not discharging veterans into homelessness with an aggressive plan to get all veterans off the streets within the next 5 years.

Mental Health:

SRS-MH has adopted a policy that would prevent discharging homeless individuals from publicly funded institutions or systems of care into homelessness or into HUD funded programs for the homeless. The policy was approved December 2006. The policy states that staff will ensure to the maximum extent practical and when appropriate that all individuals who are discharged from State funded institutions or systems of care have housing options available in order to prevent being discharged into homelessness. SRS-MH is currently developing a strategic plan to standardize the discharge planning process among all three State Mental Health Hospitals. Also see note above under health care for positive changes regarding VA programming.

Corrections:

That Kansas Department of Corrections has a formal policy regarding release and discharge planning, with planning for all offenders beginning at 16 months pre-release, or upon admission if their length of incarceration is less than 16 months. Offenders are assessed for risk and need, and plans are developed for their return to the community. Specialized re-entry and discharge planning staff are in all facilities working with offenders. Housing specialists in Topeka, Kansas City and Wichita support release and discharge planners in their effort to find suitable housing for offenders. The VA facilities that serve the BoS have hired Incarcerated Veterans program staff to interface with all verterans who are being released from correctional facilities. Two new Veterans Courts have been established and new Veterans Justice Outreach staff are in place to more effectively address the issue of Veterans who are involved in the legal system to help assure that they are released with housing in place.

KS BoS CoC staff worked with the state agency administrating HPRP helping to develop the grant selection process; and serving on the committee to review and recommend the successful applicants. KS BoS CoC encouraged and supported member agencies to apply for the funds, of which some were successful. HMIS is required for HPRP therefore BoS CoC and the administering agency will continue to work in partnership to assist and support further implementation and utilization of the HMIS system. BoS CoC is designing an evaluation process to look at how these funds fit within the homeless continuum of care and to measure the impact of HPRP especially in rural and frontier Kansas.

KS BoS CoC members actively participate and sustain on-going representation on committees addressing each of the aforementioned initiatives and are involved in developing and monitoring policies and procedures to ensure a fair and equitable process to all. KS BoS CoC serves as an information and referral resource and works to ensure BoS CoC service providers are utilizing each of these resources and programs for their participants as is appropriate.

The number of proposed permanent housing beds for 2008 was not achieved because two projects are still under construction; 30% of the transition housing participants moved to other transitional housing situations and 25% left for non-compliance or before completing the program. The number of homeless households increased as a result of the economy and a more comprehensive point in time count to better identify the homeless families. Subsequently more services have been added to serve these homeless families.

Providers stated they use the Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services online application and a online assessment for eligibility for the following benefits and services: Cash, (General Assistance and TANF), Child Support, Child Care, Energy Assistance (LIEAP), Food Assistance, Medical Assistance (Medicaid, SCHIP, Healthwave and MediKan), and Vocational Rehabilitation Services. Most case managers stated they help clients complete the SRS online application and for those programs with paper applications, they have them on-site. Respondents stated they help clients fill out the forms, if needed. Some ensure clients use an address where they will be able to receive mail for a period of time to ensure no mail and paperwork is missed. They include accessing mainstream resources in the clients goals/plans and review progress regularly. They routinely follow-up with clients to note if benefits were received, and advocate with assistance agencies to see if it is possible to receive benefits by supplying other information, or appeal process.</p>
